Doctors of the Church 24/37 St Ephrem the Syriac 306-373

Declared a Doctor of the Church (Doctor of the Syrians) by Pope Benedict XV in 1920, his Feast Day is 9 June. He was born in Nisibis, Turkey but later was in Mesopotamia (modern Iraq). He was ordained a deacon, unwilling to be ordained to the priesthood, and lived a hermit's life; his fame rests on his theological writings, written in a dialect of Aramaic which became Syriac, rich and elegant in style. He also composed over 400 hymns, written in Syriac, and designed for popular use, to counteract heretics who spread their doctrines by means of sung verses. Shortly before his death there was a famine during which he was the leader in organising help for the sick which included organising litters for use as ambulances. He is the patron saint of spiritual directors and spiritual leaders.
