

**Education Sunday** falls on the second Sunday of September just as the new academic year starts and is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in England and Wales, established 175 years ago in 1848. It provides an opportunity to celebrate and give thanks to all involved in making Catholic schools places of enlightenment, as well as to look forward in anticipation of the year ahead. Education Sunday is when Catholic Church congregations commemorate their predecessors of the 19th century,

many of whom were living in poverty, paying for schools to be built.

What is a Mass Intention? The Church teaches that Jesus died on the Cross for the salvation of all people, living and dead, of his own time and for all times. The Sacrifice of the Mass is offered, therefore, for all the living and the dead, as the words of the Eucharistic Prayer make clear. The Church also provides that each Mass, in addition, can be offered for a single named intention. When the faithful ask a priest to offer a Mass for a living person or a departed soul, it is customary for the faithful to provide

for the upkeep of the priest for that day. In the diocese of Shrewsbury, it is a suggested donation of £10.00, though one can offer more or less in accord with one's means. In this parish the Mass intention goes to the parish rather than to the priest himself, along with stole fees (donations made at Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals), and the Christmas and Easter collection. The Mass intention is usually advertised in the newsletter and announced at the Mass itself. This has a twofold purpose: to encourage the faithful to unite themselves with that intention, and to remind ourselves that the Mass is a sacrifice offered by Jesus on the Cross for our salvation. Incidentally, if the Mass is being offered for a deceased soul, the name will have 'RIP' after it. If it is offered for a living person, it will say for the intentions of the person named, sometimes Masses will be offered for the donor's intention. Mass intention envelopes can be found at the entrance to Church.

**Annual Mass Count** takes place each year during the last two weekends of September and first two weekends of October. The dates for the Mass Count this year are the Vigil Mass Saturday 21/Sunday 22 September, 28/29 September, 5/6 October, and 12/13 October. Please note the count is not taken at any of the weekday Masses nor the Saturday morning Mass at Market Drayton. The figures attending each Mass are entered onto an annual statistics form that is submitted to the diocese each year.





**Catechesis** Market Drayton Dates and Times - Tuesday evenings at 7:00pm and Wednesday mornings at 11:00am.
