Doctors of the Church 26/37 St John of the Cross The Mystical Doctor, 1542-91. Feast day 24 Nov.

Juan de Yepes was born in Àvila, Old Castile, Spain, the son of a weaver of good family in reduced circumstances. He became a Carmelite friar in1563, and St Teresa chose him to lead the reform of the men's Order. He was imprisoned and treated with great inhumanity by his superiors in the last months before his death in 1591. Only after his death was he recognised as the co-founder of the reformed (Discalced) Carmelites. He was canonised in 1726 and declared a Doctor by Pope Pius XI in in 1926. His teaching is contained in treatises, letters and long poems (The Scent of Mt Carmel, The Dark Night of the Soul, the Spiritual Canticle. He wrote of divine things from the depths of his own

experience, with great literary talent. "Take God for your spouse and friend and walk with him continually, and you will not sin and will learn to love, and the things you must do will work out prosperously for you."

Commemoration of all the faithful departed (All Souls) Saturday 2nd November. We are fast approaching the feast of All Souls, the day the Church sets aside to pray for all the faithful departed. This year Mass will be offered at 9:30 am at Market Drayton, and at 10:00 am at Newport. During these Masses we will pray for our dear departed loved ones, and all those who have died and who have no one to pray for them. The whole month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. We offer sheets for you to write the names of your departed loved ones that will be kept in a casket by the altar at every Mass of every day during November. There is also an envelope should you wish to make a Mass offering for the Masses offered for the Holy Souls throughout the month of November. We will also hold our annual service of blessing of graves at the Cemetery in Market Drayton and Newport. At Market Drayton the service will take place on Wednesday 6th November at 12:30pm meeting by the entrance to the Cemetery. The service at Newport Cemetery will take place on Friday 8th November at 11:30am. Family and friends of those who are buried at the two Cemeteries are warmly invited to the Blessing of Graves, a commemoration of all the faithful departed buried or whose remains are interred there and an opportunity to pray for the repose of their souls. Family and friends are then invited to gather at the graveside of their loved one, and Fr Lee, Deacon David, or Deacon Wilf will pray alongside them and bless the grave with Holy Water.
